The benefits of relationships between caregivers and children. To best support healthy brain development, the child's connection to the caregiver must be strong and positive. Through the child's relationships and the context of those relationships, the rapidly developing brain starts to structure itself, creating the foundation for future learning. Infants and toddlers in thriving relationships with special adults feel safe, protected, appreciated, and loved. When an infant establishes a connection with a sensitive and responsive caregiver, the infant learns who to trust and turn to when needing support. Children use adults as secure bases from which to explore their world and to return to when they need to feel safe or desire food, attention, or a hug. Young children who experience secure relationships are happier, kinder, more social, less anxious, and better learners than those children who do not feel secure.

The most important relationship to a child is the one they develop with their parent or caregiver. Children learn about the world around them through a positive parent-child relationship. As they are growing and changing, children look to their parents to determine whether they are safe, secure, and loved. It is also the foundation from which they will build their future relationships.

Contact us for support with children exhibiting challenging behaviors and other concerning emotional or behavioral signs/symptoms (who are enrolled in state licensed daycare settings). This is a free support available to support social-emotional development and to promote positive mental health in children ages birth to five and their caregivers.

PROCESS FOR TRAININGS:

<u>Training Registration Deadline</u>: Each training will close 48 hours (2 days) prior to any Zoom training and 1 week prior to face-to-face trainings. Please DO NOT submit more than one registration.

<u>Pretest</u>: A link to the pretest will be emailed by **<u>5 pm</u>** 2 days prior to the training.

Pretest Deadline: You must submit the pretest the day after you receive it by 10 am.

Meeting ID and Password: This information will be sent out before **5 pm** the day the pretest closes.

(Exception: Trainings scheduled for 6 pm: you will receive the meeting ID and password before <u>3 pm</u> the day of the training.)

Posttest/Evaluation: The posttest/evaluation will be emailed after the training by 5 pm

(Exception: Trainings scheduled for 6 pm: the trainer will communicate if you will receive the posttest/evaluation directly after the training OR by **10 am** the following morning).

<u>Posttest/Evaluation Deadline:</u> You must complete <u>BOTH</u> the posttest/evaluation. ACCESS TO THESE FORMS WILL END AFTER THREE BUSINESS DAYS AND YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE A CERTIFICATE PER DHR POLICY.

<u>Certificates:</u> The certificates will be emailed once the post test and evaluation forms close. Please expect certificates on the third business day after the training.

FOR ZOOM TRAININGS:

- Participants are expected to stay on the entire zoom training. You must have your name as your username to receive credit for attending the training. However, just a box with your name is not sufficient for participation, you must be seen on the Zoom training. If you do not have a webcam, please contact the trainer for accommodations.
- Please make sure you have allotted time for the Zoom training. Participants who are driving or attending to other matters while on the Zoom training will not receive a certificate.
- Please try to keep distractions at a minimum while on the Zoom training. We realize this is sometimes difficult but having other adults, children or pets present during the training can be distracting to other participants.
- You may not enter a Zoom training more than 5 minutes after it begins. Please make sure in advance that you have the Zoom app on your tablet or phone or go to www.Zoom.us on your computer.
